CV - J.C. RAJARAO

J.C. Rajarao, known as JC or just Rao, is an old boy of the Penang Free School which he joined in 1947. Rao left school in 1953 and joined the University of Malaya (in Singapore) and graduated in 1958 with a First Class Honours degree in History, his thesis being “Public Administration in Penang: 1786 – 1832” obviously reflecting his deep links with Penang. After teaching history for a year at the University of Singapore, he left for the School of Oriental & African Studies in 1959 on a British Council Scholarship and subsequently was awarded the Commonwealth Scholarship. However, differences between him and one of his supervisors in his interpretation of facts in his thesis titled “The Development of Local Self-Government in Malaya”, caused him to resign his scholarship and return home without his post-graduate degree.

Rao joined PFS as a teacher from 1962 to mid-1964. He then joined the Socialist run Penang City Council as the Asst. City Secretary. He left the City Council when the Barisan National government took over the Council’s administration and abolished the elected representative system. He joined the Rubber Research Institute of Malaysia (RRIM) in 1996. At the RRIM, he became the Head of the Publications, Library and Information Division and its principal public relations link with Universities and public media until he retired in 1987.

Since retirement, he has edited and published more than a couple of books related to the development of natural rubber and plastics in Malaysia. One of the books he recently authored is titled “The Legacy of MARDEC: Its Origin, Development and Contributions to the Natural Rubber Industry.” Some Old Frees perhaps know him best for his short book on the “History of Penang Free School, and the Kuala Lumpur & Selangor Old Frees Association”.

In all, Rao has led a very active life, and remains steadfast with his principles and certainly enjoys a sharp sense of humour. And for a man who is hitting 82 his life style is amazing. He says “Age does not matter; but what matters should not age!”
